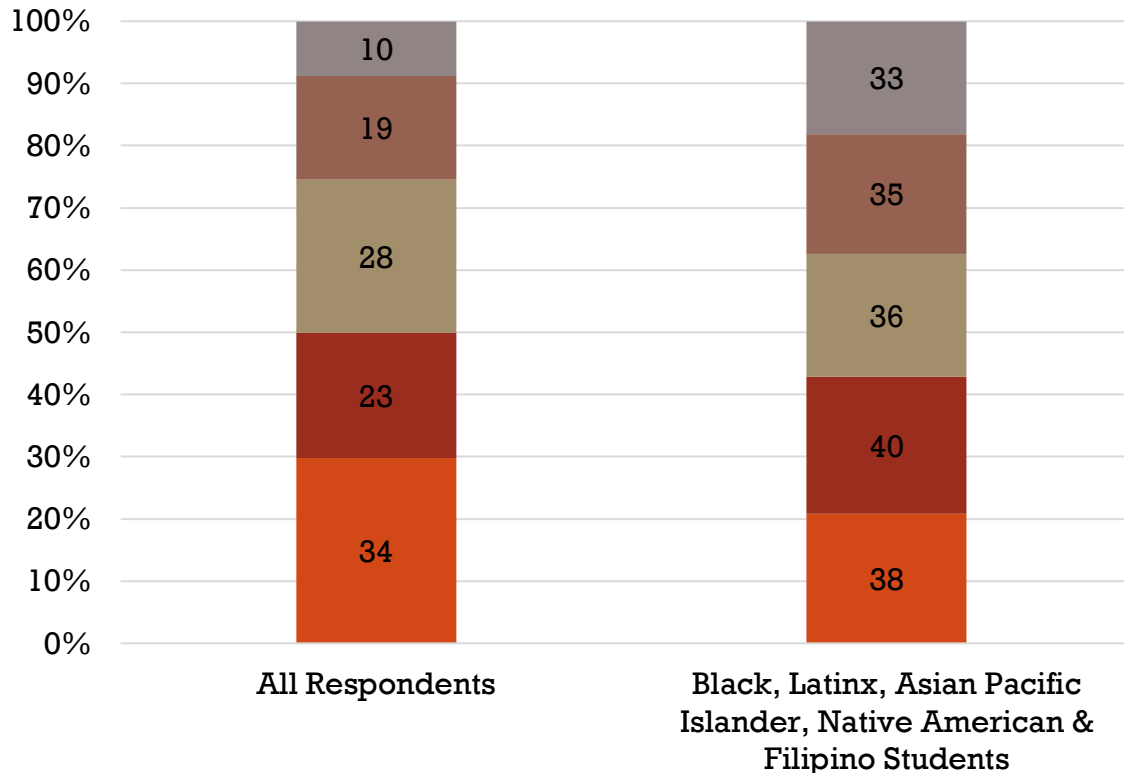

# Have you, your friends, or family had your education progress or life trajectory destabilized by class cuts?

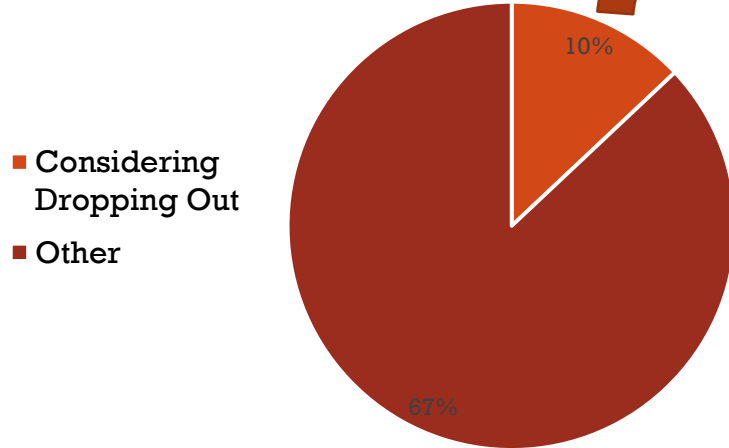


- I am considering dropping out of CCSF as a result of class cuts

- I cannot fulfill a major or minor requirement for transfer as a result of class cuts / I cannot complete my certificate as a result of class cuts

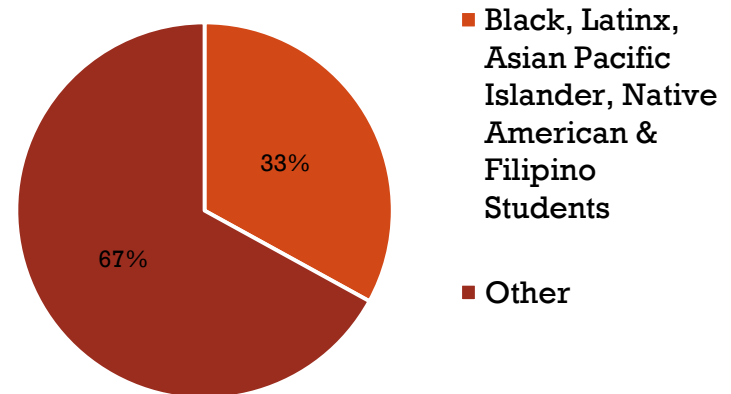
